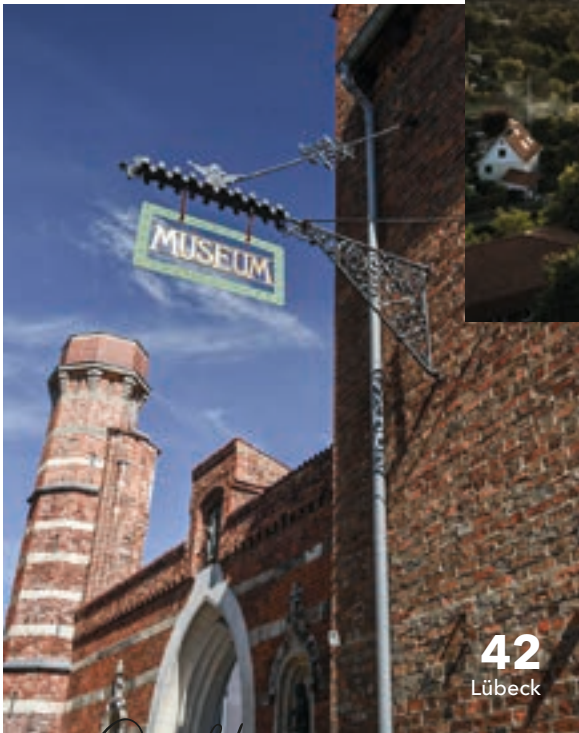

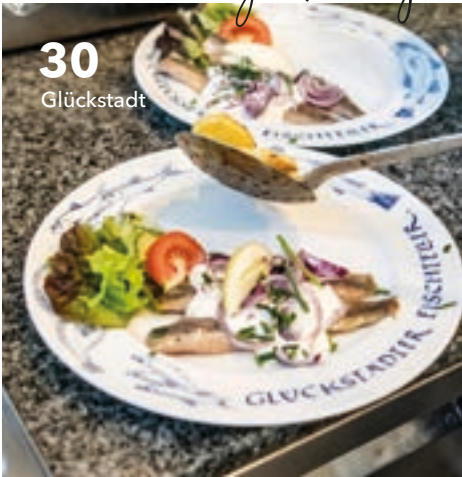

Ahrensburg

Fairytale moated castle in
a picturesque natural setting: Ahrensburg delights
all culture and outdoor fans alike.



With roughly 34,000 inhabitants, the largest town in the Stormarn district is located directly on the outskirts of Hamburg, and is easy to reach both by car and by train. The town's magnificent landmark is the snow-white Renaissance-style **moated castle** built around 1595, with its four pointed towers and three ornamental gables. It once served as a manor house for an aristocratic Ahrensburg estate. Today, it combines both past and present; it is a museum of Schleswig-Holstein aristocratic culture and a venue for a wide variety of cultural events – from readings and concerts to open-air cinema screenings in the castle park. Inside, visitors glide on slippers through eras of sophisticated culture and

follow in the footsteps of the castle's former residents and their servants. The **'History Cabinet'** which, at just under 16 square metres, is probably the smallest permanent exhibition in Schleswig-Holstein, is dedicated to more practical issues: Where did the bath water come from 300 years ago? What did a chef earn? And how hard did the maids have to work?

To the south of Ahrensburg lies the **'Stellmoor-Ahrensburger-Tunneltal' nature reserve**. The marshy forests and wet meadows are home to numerous animal and plant species, some of which are rare. On a hike through the area, information boards draw your attention to important **archaeological**

sites. Reindeer hunters belonging to so-called 'Ahrensburg culture' left their traces in the late Palaeolithic period: They used bows and arrows as weapons, developed a new hunting technique along the way and bagged extensive prey in the process. A unique feature from the present day can be found on the **'Moorwanderweg' hiking trail**: A 320 metre long, floating wooden bridge crosses the landscape. Surrounded by old beech and oak trees, the floating bridge ends at the foot of an early medieval castle mound.

‘Marstall am Schloss’ cultural centre

The stables in Ahrensburg form part of a **historical complex** and were built in the middle of the 19th century for breeding purposes. The three-winged complex is located opposite the castle and has been a cultural centre since 1989; it is run by an official association. In addition to exhibitions in the ‘Galerie im Marstall’ (run by the ‘Sparkassen-Kulturstiftung Stormarn’ foundation), the cultural centre in the riding hall and coach house offers a wide range of events for you to enjoy: readings, concerts, films and theatre. It is also available as a room for conferences, congresses and celebrations.

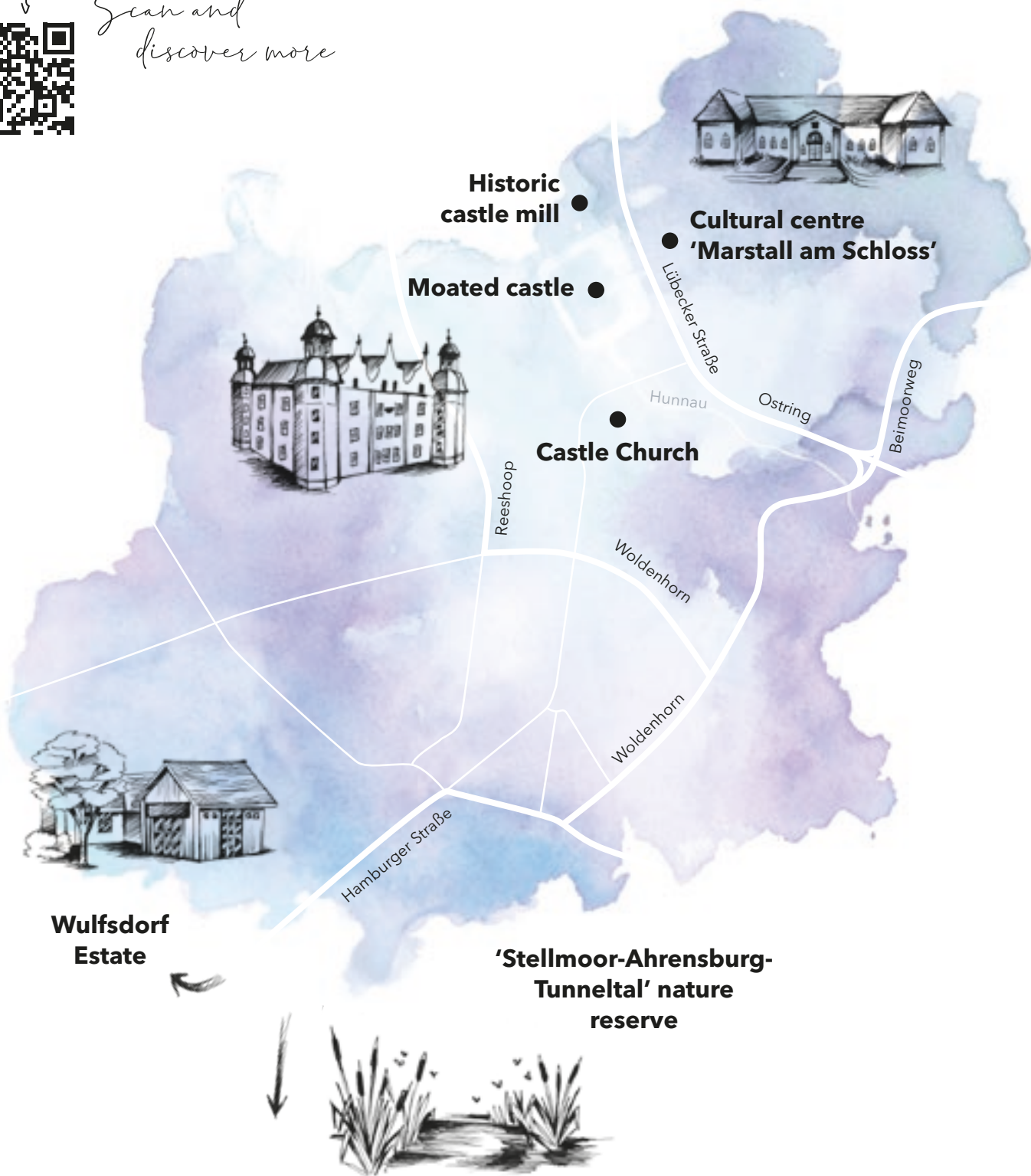
A 320 metre long floating wooden bridge, unique in Germany, crosses the 340 hectare nature reserve in the Ahrensburg tunnel valley.

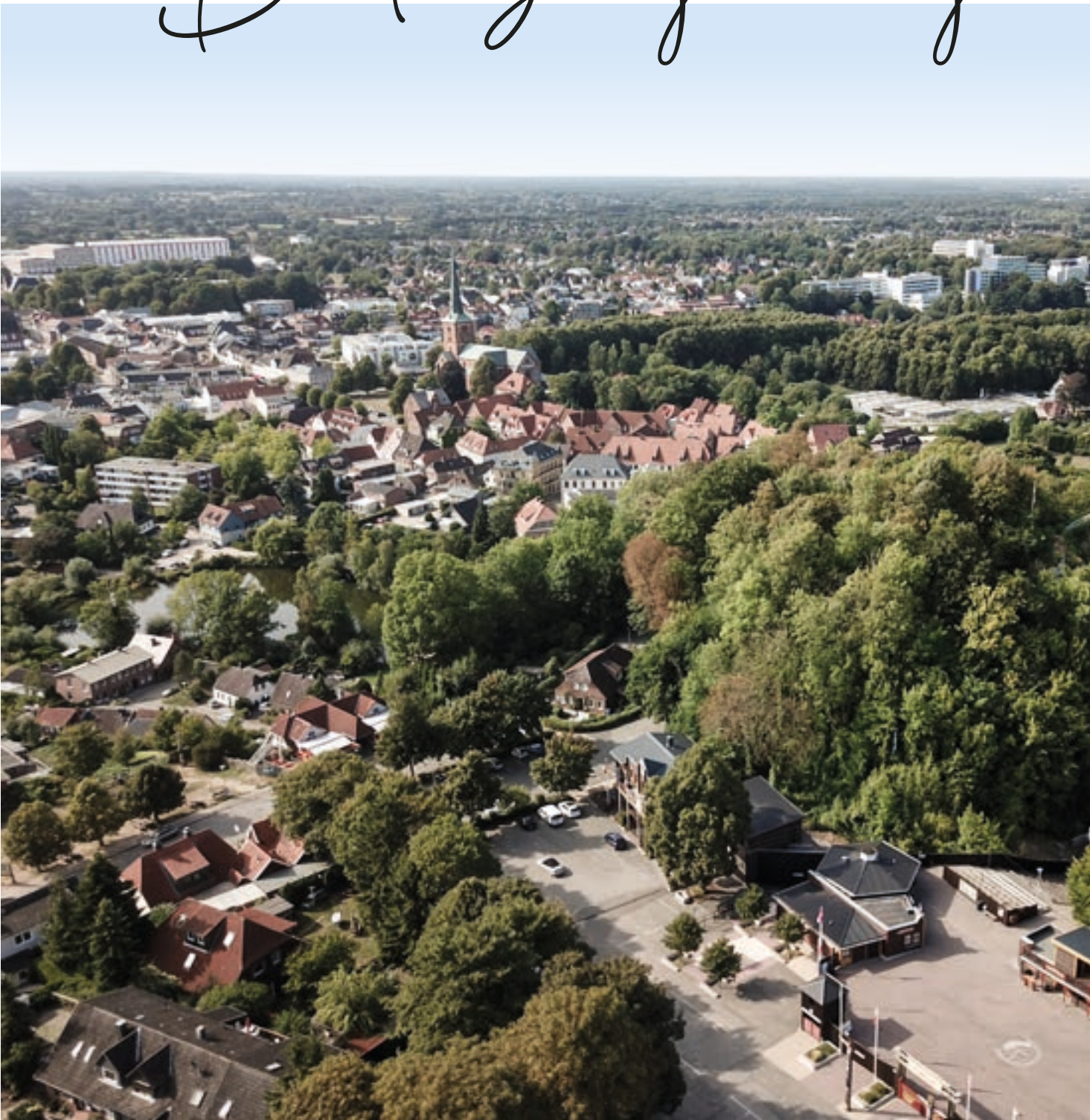

Bad Segeberg



Bats, horse-riding festivals, Wild West adventures - there's a lot going on in the climatic health resort around the Kalkberg!

The district town of Bad Segeberg, with a population of around 19,000, is located in the middle of the geographical triangle formed by Hamburg, Lübeck and Kiel and on the edge of the 'Holsteinische Schweiz' Nature Park. Due to its strategically favourable location, Emperor Lothar III, on the advice of the missionary Vicelin, had a fortress **built on the top of the Kalkberg** in 1134 and a monastery at its foot. The former Sigeberg castle gave the village its name and repeatedly played an important role in the power struggles of the following centuries. The **Karl May theatre festival** have made Bad Segeberg famous throughout Germany. For 70 years, they have been performed in the summer months in the open-air theatre against the backdrop of the region's 'Kalkberg' or 'Chalk Mountain'. The exciting adventures of the blood brothers Winnetou and Old Shatterhand delight entire families; stars from film and television enrich the ensemble every year. Next door is home to the Indian Village with the rustic western town of LaGrande. There, visitors can stroll from saloon to sheriff, children discover shiny nuggets while panning for gold and an exhibition informs about 'The World of the American Indians'.

Modern equestrians also meet regularly in Bad Segeberg for the '**Horse Festival of the North**'. They compete in various disciplines on the country showground and celebrate together. In addition, the annual state tournament with the championships in show jumping and dressage for Schleswig-Holstein and Hamburg takes place on the race paddock. Below the Kalkberg is a **unique natural cave** - Northern Europe's largest natural bat roost. If you want to learn more about these special animals, **why not visit the Noctalis bat centre** with its interactive experience exhibition. The 'Große Segeberger See' lake **with its lake promenade**, open-air swimming pool and boat rental offers a high recreational value. Adjacent thereto is **the health park with** various clinics and other health-promoting facilities. At the 'Aktivplatz' on the south shore of the lake, walkers can enjoy a Kneipp session, work out on outdoor equipment or simply relax. **Active holidaymakers** also make use of the numerous hiking and cycling trails, for example, along the Trave or in the Ihlsee and Ihlwald nature reserve.

Unique natural monument in the centre of the city

Wild West in Bad Segeberg

Noctalis, bats and the Kalkberg

Below the 'Kalkberg', you will be guided through northern Germany's only accessible natural cave. In winter, the '**Kalkberg Cave**' serves as winter quarters for over 30,000 bats. **Noctalis, bats and the Kalkberg** is an interactive experience exhibition for both young and old about little creatures that see with their ears – bats. With a torch in hand, you go on a voyage of discovery and even meet the live colony in all its splendour.



St. Mary Church

The 'St. Mary Church' – one of the most important Romanesque buildings in northern Germany – stands directly on the market square in the pedestrian zone of Bad Segeberg's town centre. Its construction began in 1156. It was the first building ever in which the vault was created from brick. One particularly noteworthy detail worth a visit are the magnificent, carved altar erected around 1515 and the bronze baptismal font from 1447.



Karl May theatre festival

The 'Karl May theatre festival' are an exciting Wild West adventure for the whole family. You can expect breathtaking stunts, spectacular pyrotechnics, a touch of romance and lots of fun. And all this in **one of the most beautiful open-air theatres in Europe**.



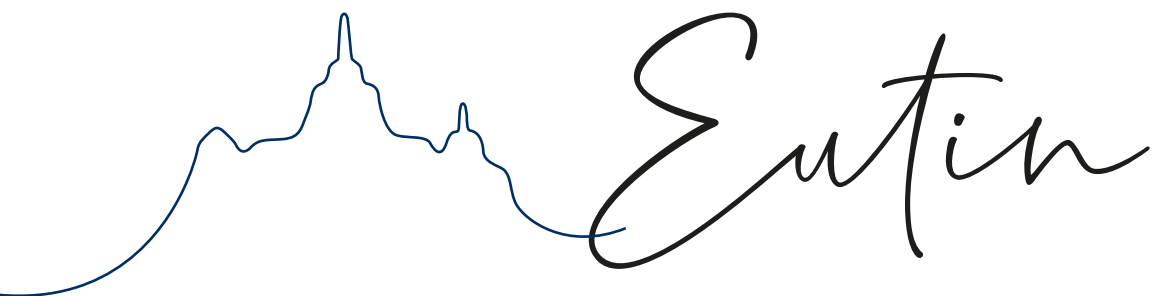
City tours with a difference

Experience Bad Segeberg in a different way: with your own smartphone! With the **free Future History App**, you can immerse yourself in the moving history of Bad Segeberg during the tour 'Bad Segeberg – Past and Present'. Pictures from back then show what it used to look like right here. The 'Stolpersteine' or 'Stumbling Stones' tour is dedicated to the history of the Jews in Bad Segeberg and the 'Art in Public Spaces' tour shows works of art, some of which are by nationally renowned artists. Each tour leads you via **integrated navigation** to the individual stations, where informative text, image, voice and sometimes video files await you.

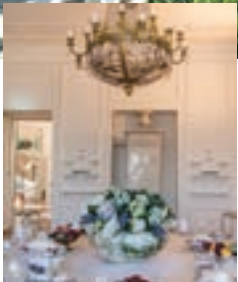
Eutin, also known as the 'Weimar of the North', welcomes visitors with its scenic nature: numerous lakes, forests and rolling hills.

The cultural heart of 'Holstein Switzerland' beats in Eutin. You can feel it, for example, by exploring the 'bel étage' of the former **Prince-Bishop's Castle** with the media guide, when walking in the footsteps of Eutin's Carl Maria von Weber in the neighbouring **museum** or while on a tour with a night watchman in historical costume. If you like, you can also go on a tasting tour to

the brewery, search for kingfishers and otters on a lake cruise, enjoy a cappuccino at the old market or browse the small shops nestled in the alleyways. From Eutin, the surrounding hilly landscape with its forests and lakes is ideal for hiking. Or you can set off on a cycling or canoeing tour from the city's nature park, which starts right by the city bay.

Flensburg

The idyllic little harbour metropolis on the Danish border offers the full programme: from culture and shopping, to culinary experiences and events – such as the traditional ‘Rumregatta’!

Located in the north of Schleswig-Holstein, Flensburg lives up to its reputation. The Scandinavian flair that radiates from the cosy **old town streets** and the area around the harbour can be felt in every way. It’s less than half an hour by bike to the ‘Schusterkate’ border crossing in Wassersleben. All the beaches offer a view of the nearby Danish coast, and the Danish language can be heard

in many places. The city of two cultures has plenty to offer, as Flensburg’s history is closely linked to that of its Danish neighbours. Traces of the past can still be seen and experienced in the region’s famous **rum city** to this day. Nature fans can explore the beautiful **coastal landscape** and the hilly ‘Angeln peninsula’ by bike or on foot. In between, natural **beach oases** invite you to while away the hours.

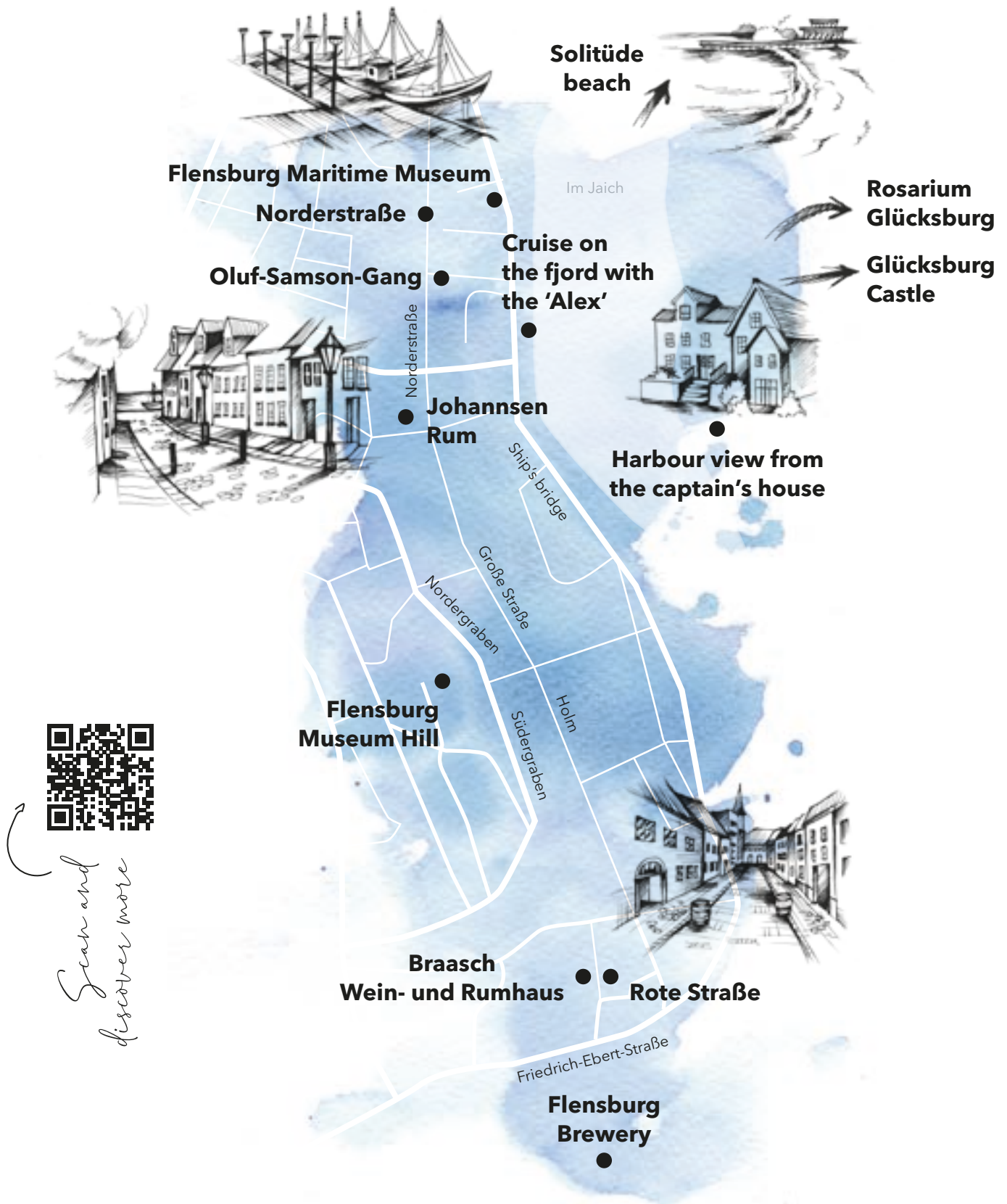

Friedrichstadt



400 years after the city was founded, the Dutch wind continues to blow here in 'Little Amsterdam'.

In Friedrichstadt, there is culture and architecture paired with 'joie de vivre' waiting for you to discover, for example, during a **city tour on the water**.

Guests sail along the narrow canals under small bridges and let the pretty stepped gabled houses of the old town drift by. City guides show interested visitors the small shops in Prinzenstraße and the 'Alte Münze' museum. Artists burst with creativity in the galleries, studios and workshops. Friedrichstadt inspires all with its history about the diverse and

exciting religious development that characterises the city. It offers places of worship for five denominations – the 'Remonstrantenkirche' – the only one outside the Netherlands – is well worth a visit. **On foot, by bike or on the water, you can explore the romantic river landscape** of Eider-Treene-Sorge or to the North Sea peninsula of Eiderstedt.

Glückstadt

The royal dream on the Elbe exudes a very special charm at every turn with its small, dreamy alleyways.

The small, dreamy alleyways lead to the harbour. A walk to the pier rewards you with a breathtaking view over the Elbe. This **happy city** offers a young, lively art scene with numerous galleries and studios, the Detlefsen Museum and the 'Palais für aktuelle Kunst'. A trip on the **'Rigmor'** sailing boat is both adventurous and relaxing at the same time, which is sure to not only delight fans of maritime culture. The culinary speciality of Glückstadt should, of course, not be missed on a city trip: the **'Original Glückstädter Matjes'**. In honour of this herring delicacy, the city on the Elbe even celebrates a big four-day festival every year in June.

The 'Molenfeuer' lighthouse

The white lighthouse at the outer harbour not only marks the entrance to **Glückstadt harbour**, but also invites you to while away the time.



There is plenty to see here: big boats, screeching sea-gulls and endless expanses for the eye to behold. From this spot, you can watch beautiful sunsets in a wonderfully relaxed atmosphere.



Detlefsen Museum

'Brockdorff Palace' was built in 1631/32 and is home to colourful stories and exciting exhibits from the last centuries of Glückstadt.

The street '**Am Hafen**' is considered the most important waterfront road in northern Germany. It lives from the varied interplay of the façades and the romantic wild roses.

Sailing ship 'Rigmor'

The 'Rigmor' from Glückstadt is the oldest sailing ship in Germany that, to this day, is still in working order, and which invites you to embark on an exciting **journey** through time on a sailing tour with this traditional ship. 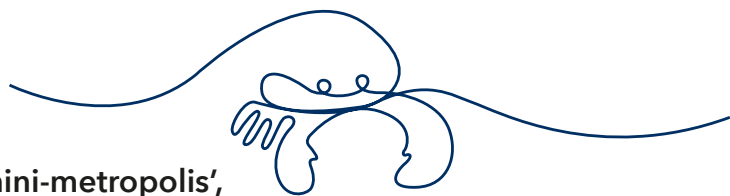

Husum

The cosy North Sea harbour town of Husum is located directly on the unique **Wadden Sea UNESCO World Heritage Site** with its idyllic islands and Halligen. The maritime ambience at Husum harbour delights all who visit. In the city centre, you can breathe in a fresh sea breeze or experience the ebb and flow of the tide

up close. Events such as the harbour and crab days and the largest Christmas market on the Schleswig-Holstein North Sea coast feel right at home in Husum. The writer **Theodor Storm** is omnipresent as Husum's most famous son, and is also a constant companion on guided (and themed) tours of the town. In spring, the park

around the only castle on the North Sea coast of Schleswig-Holstein is transformed into a sea of purple crocuses. The **'west coast metropolis'** invites you to shop while enjoying a historic city backdrop, and offers an impressive cultural programme with its numerous museums, concerts and readings.

Wadden Sea

The Wadden Sea is unique in the world. Its appearance is constantly changing with the rhythm of ebb and flow. The tide comes and goes twice a day, washing over the mudflats and draining through the tideways. In this **World Heritage Site**, nature can unfold with maximum freedom, while at the same time offering travellers unique experiences in harmony with nature. Husum plays a special role in this, being home to the WWF Wadden Sea Office and the Wadden Sea Protection Centre.

Husum Castle

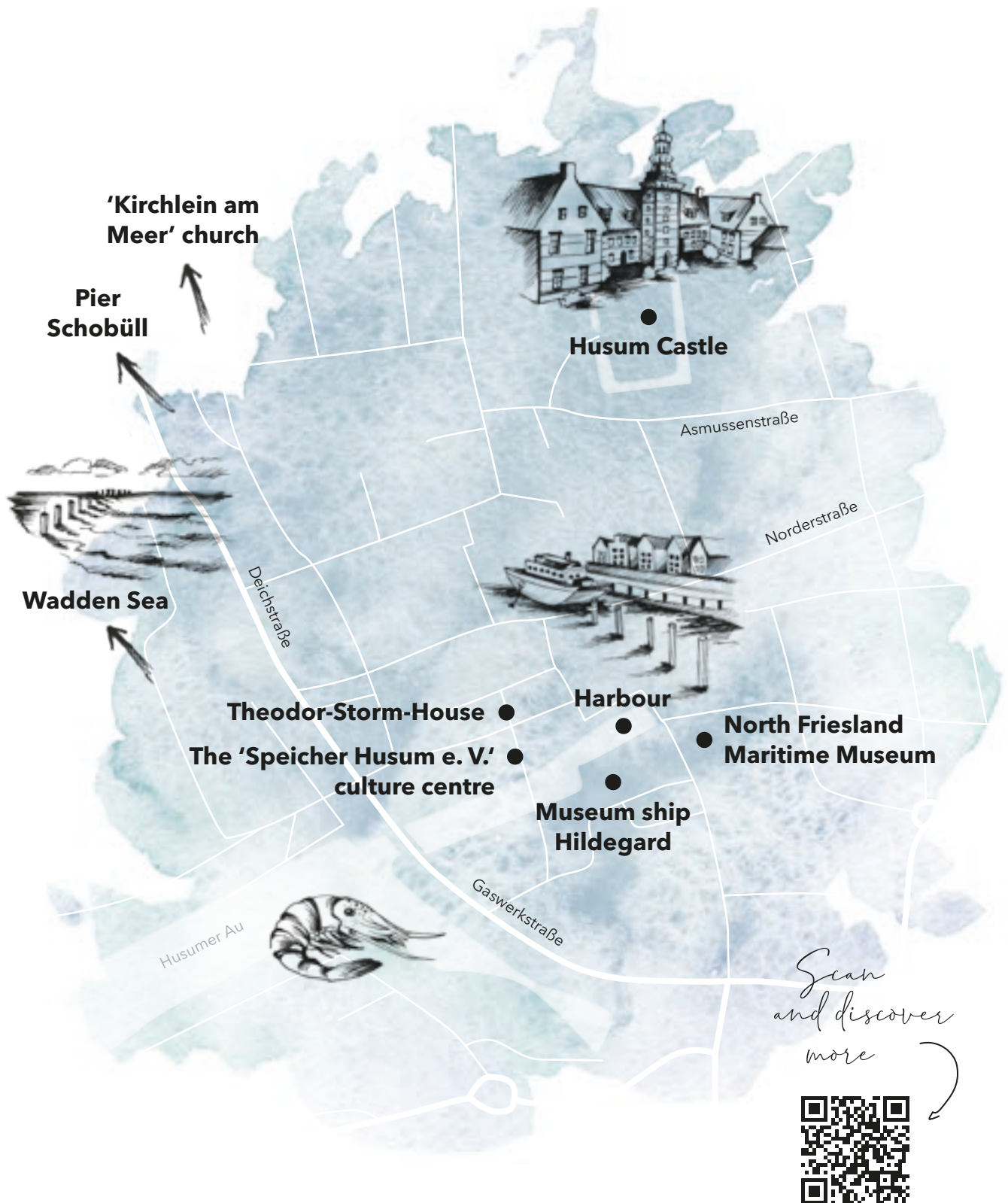
The castle park - with many walking paths, a playground and the Theodor Storm monument - stretches around the castle outside Husum. One particular highlight is the crocus blossom in spring.

Lübeck

Narrow alleyways and historic houses, salty air and proud sailors, marzipan and maritime flavours - that's Lübeck in a nutshell!

The **UNESCO** declared the medieval town centre a World Heritage Site in 1987. The imposing **Holsten Gate in Lübeck**, landmark and entrance portal of the '**Queen of the Hanseatic League**', with its late Gothic façade and Lübeck's motto 'Concordia domi foris pax'. The old town island with its unique brick architecture and the numerous small oases off the central paths is just as relaxed in northern Germany. The **Old Town of Lübeck** is completely surrounded by water thanks to the rivers Trave and Wakenitz. During a barge tour, an electric boat tour or a SUP tour, you can marvel at the Hanseatic city from a completely different perspective. **Tip:** The Malerwinkel on the Obertrave offers a particularly beautiful view. Directly behind the banks of the River Trave rise the seven towers of the five old town churches that have made Lübeck's skyline famous. The **museum landscape** in Lübeck is characterised by the history of the city and the personalities associated with it. Those interested can follow in the footsteps of Thomas Mann, Günter Grass and Willy Brandt, and get to know the Nobel Prize winners better in various exhibitions. The **European Hanseatic Museum** is the world's largest exhibition centre dedicated to the history of the Hanseatic League, and takes visitors on a fascinating journey back in time to the Middle Ages. The **Old Town** is transformed during the **advent season** into a shining sea of lights, and enchants all who visit with its unique Christmas and craft markets.

The painter, Stanislaw, has been drawing the city's famous 'Holstentor' gate since 1984.



A picturesque experience at Lübeck

The Holsten Gate

The famous 'Holstentor' gate was once a symbol of power and an important part of the city fortifications, which were intended to protect the rich Hanseatic city from enemy attacks. Inside you can see the exhibition 'The Power of Trade' on the history of Lübeck as the centre of Northern European trade routes.



The painter's corner 'Malerwinkel'

The small green area on the edge of Lübeck's old town is located on the west bank of the River Trave in the immediate vicinity of the 'Dankwartsbrücke', a wooden pedestrian crossing. The square offers a marvellous view of medieval houses, with laundry flapping in the wind and the splendid cathedral.



St. Mary's Church

The Lübeck market and main parish church of St. Mary's ('Marienkirche') is considered the **mother church of brick Gothic** and served as a model for around 70 churches in the Baltic region. The three-nave basilica is home to the highest brick vault in the world.

Museum Quarter St. Annen

Once a monastery, and today a modern art gallery and one of the most beautiful museums in Germany. The quarter is home to unique art treasures and offers a glimpse inside **Lübeck's World Heritage Site**.

Mölln

Do you enjoy travelling,
and are up for some great
fun? Let's go to the city
of German folk hero 'Till
Eulenspiegel'.

There is hardly a street or a square without his presence. The famous jester has left his mark all over Mölln: Till is waiting at the '**Eulenspiegel fountain**' on the historic market square. Rubbing the thumb and toe of the bronze at the same time and making a wish is said to bring good luck. In the 'most beautiful **spa gardens** in northern Germany' with its colourful themed gardens and refreshing water features, Till also follows locals and guests wherever they choose to go, and virtually every step of the way. Active guests can find respite from the jester's pranks by hiking or cycling along kilometres of nature trails and visiting the region's 'Animal park Uhlenkrog'.



St. Nicolai Church

St. Nicolai Church is dedicated to St. Nicholas, the patron saint of merchants and sailors.

Mölln spa gardens ‘Kurpark’

The listed spa gardens are located in the centre of the city of Mölln, and turn every visit into an unforgettable experience. The park has some surprising moments in store for its guests, such as a singing anvil!



Eulenspiegel fountain

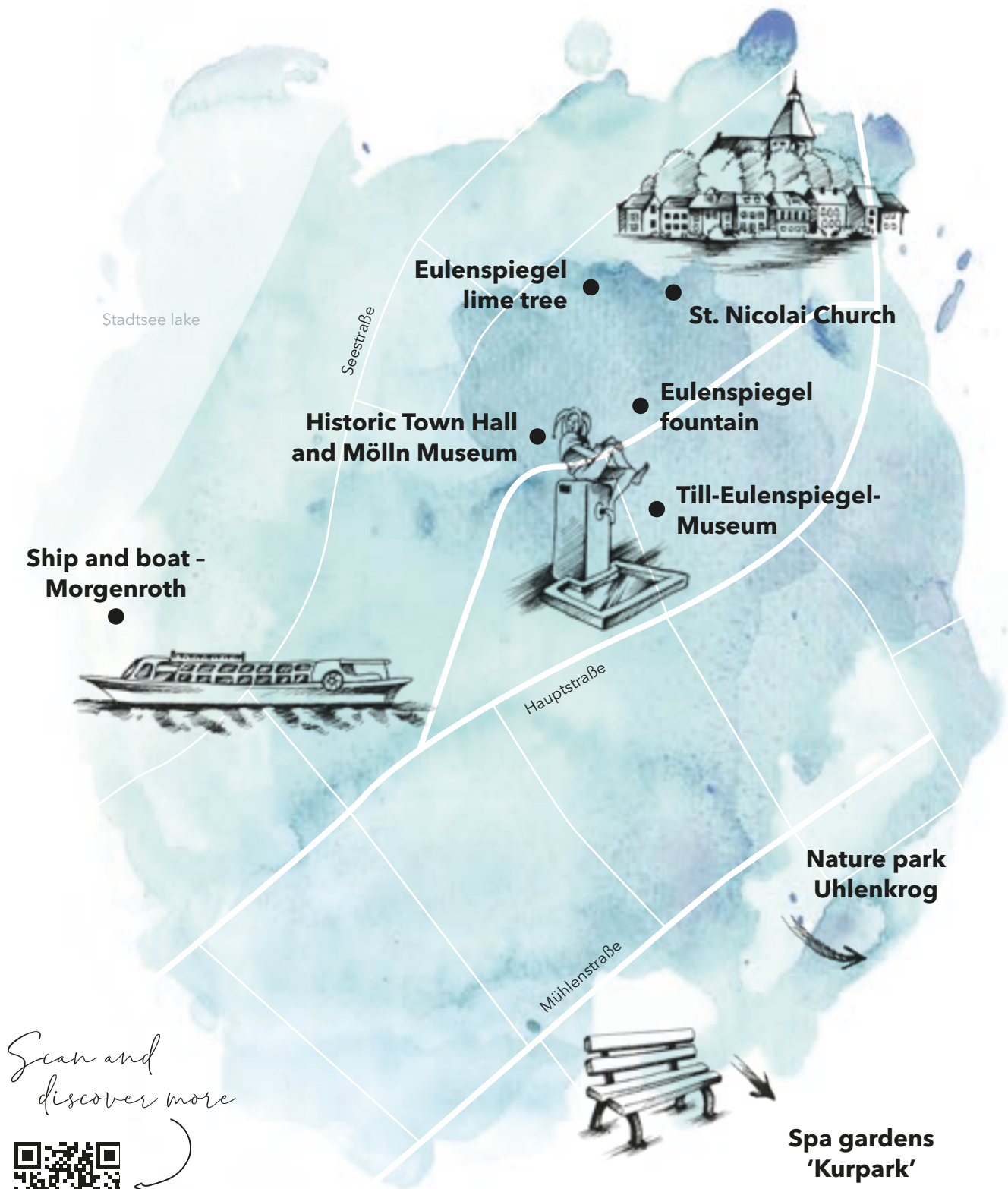
To commemorate Till Eulenspiegel, who according to legend died 600 years ago, Mölln sculptor Karlheinz Goedtke created the bronze figure of this famous jester in 1950 to crown the fountain next to the Kirchberg. It has since become the city’s landmark.

Round trip lakes

Mölln city centre is surrounded by a chain of three lakes. During a boat trip on the MS Till stimulating and amusing stories about the city, its lakes and Till Eulenspiegel are shared. A special treat on an evening cruise: the magnificent play of colours in the water as the sun sinks into the horizon.

cafés and restaurants located in the 'Holsten-Galerie'.

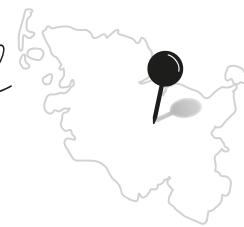

Plön lies in the heart of Holstein Switzerland and directly on the shores of **the lake 'Großer Plöner See'**. The picturesque old town with its pretty Hanseatic-style houses, narrow alleyway – which were originally used as fire extinguishing routes – and small street cafés invites you to stroll and discover. Visitors can relax and unwind on shady avenues and in the former baroque garden behind the 'Prinzenhaus'. **The 'White Castle'** shines majestically above it all. Rendsburg

Luxury liners and other ocean-going vessels pass by on the Kiel Canal, the 'blue line' on the pavement leads through the historic city centre and you can combine sightseeing with a shopping spree on the shopping mile. What would Rendsburg be without the NOK? It turned the former Danish fortress into an important harbour in the inland region between the coasts. The Kiel Canal also gave the city its impressive landmark: the two-and-a-half kilometre long **railway bridge** with the world-famous **High Bridge**. The longest and toughest rowing regatta in the world is also prestigious, attracting the world's top international eights teams to the canal city every year!

The cityscape is characterised by a harmonious blend of modernity and nostalgia, lovingly restored buildings and a variety of shopping opportunities. A 'blue line' leads visitors from one sight to another. The colourful museum landscape and the lively cultural scene leave their beautiful mark on the region. Located centrally in Schleswig-Holstein, Rendsburg is an ideal starting point for tourist activities: cycling along the 'Ochsenweg' and the NOK, carriage rides to historic estates, boat trips on the canal and the Eider.

High railway bridge

The **railway bridge** represents a landmark of the town of Rendsburg and is a must-see! From the very top, you can admire the NOK from a height of 40 metres. Another highlight of the **'Iron Lady'** is the high bridge, which can carry up to four vehicles and 100 people.



Parade Ground 'Paradeplatz'

The **Parade Ground** denotes the former centre of the **Rendsburg fortress** and was the scene of important events in Schleswig-Holstein's history.

'NordArt'

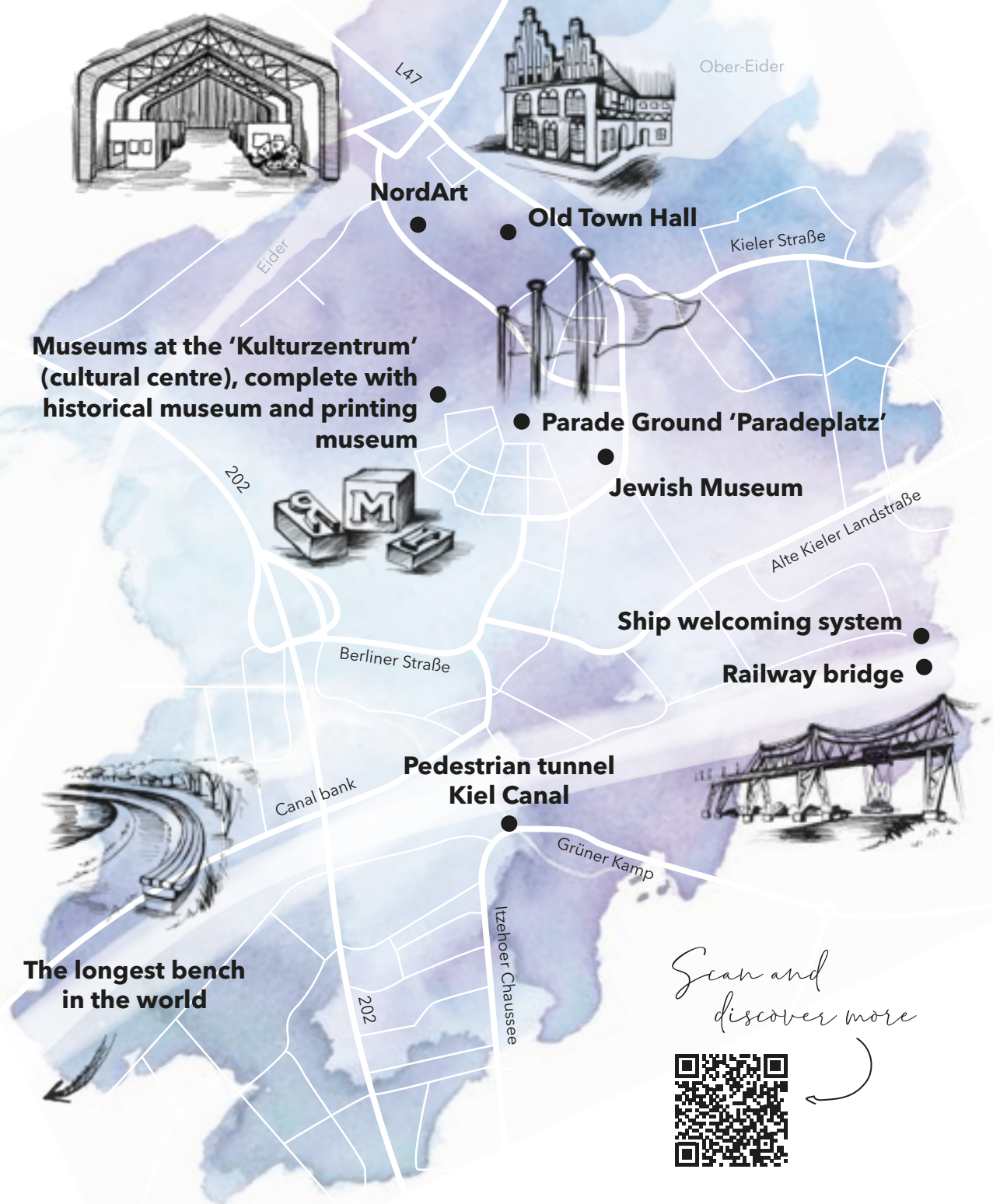

The **Old Town Hall** located in the **medieval town centre** is one of the oldest buildings in Rendsburg. The characteristic stepped gable with its modern carillon attracts all eyes of passers-by. During a guided tour, you can take a look up the historic meeting room or the mayor's office.
